Across the world, many churches lack teachers trained to handle Scripture in its original languages. Rigorous study of biblical texts is not optional—it is essential for faithful preaching, teaching, and scholarship.

To address this need, **Tyndale House** offers the *Seminar for Advanced Technical Skills in Biblical Studies*, an initiative that equips scholars in the majority world through intensive, on-site study.

Following a pilot seminar in 2025, we will return to **Nairobi** in September 2026 to continue expanding scholars' expertise in the **Greek New Testament**—with a particular focus on manuscripts, grammar, and interpretation.

Applicants should have:

- Intermediate proficiency in **New Testament Greek** (≈ 2 years of study)
- Ongoing or completed **biblical studies education** (MA, MTh, PhD, or equivalent)
- Commitment to Scripture and active church involvement
- Strong recommendations from church and academic mentors
